WORSHIP COMMITTEE

The worship committee met May 9th at Daniel's Kitchen. We discussed the events that occurred since the past meeting in February.

Appreciation was expressed for the choir music during Lent and for the Easter Sunday service. We discussed the number of hymns during the service and decided that, since Methodists are a singing denomination, four hymns during the service is an appropriate number. We also discussed whether we thought that we should have a postlude following the service. We decided that since people immediately begin visiting after the end of the service, they would not be listening anyway.

Boy Scout Sunday was snowed out this year. We learned that the Church Council has designed a policy for dealing with snowy Sundays. Decisions for cancelling Sunday services will be made on Saturday evenings and announced through social media.

The committee was satisfied with the attendance at the special services on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and the sunrise service. We will plan to continue those services in the future.

The committee made plans for High School Senior Recognition Sunday. The church provided Wesley Study Bibles for both Maya Voight and Ryan Mead. Pictures were projected on the media screens, and both girls were invited to share their plans for the future.

June plans include Communion on June 2nd, Pentecost is June 9th, and Margaret will make sure that Red paraments are put out. The Pacific Northwest Annual Conference is concluding on Pentecost Sunday, and both Pastor Dirk and Kevin will be in Puyallup. Pastor Rex Van Beek will lead the service that Sunday.

June 16th is Trinity Sunday. Pastor Dirk will be able to lead worship, but will be in the middle of his annual training, which is again at the Yakima Training Center. That Sunday is also Peace with Justice Sunday, which is one of the six Sundays with Special Offerings. Margaret will change the paraments to white for Trinity Sunday. June 23rd will include a special barbeque for soldiers at the Training Center, if they are able to attend, as well as the congregation.

Independence Day Sunday is July 7th. There will be an outdoor service on the porch of the church. A Service for Blessing of the Backpacks will be held on August 25th, as school starts on August 26th in Selah and on August 28th in Yakima. There will be a Blessing of the Beasts on September 1st that will be held on the church porch.

The next committee meeting will be held July 11th at 11:30 AM at Nana Kate's. People who are interested in worship are always welcome at the meetings.
