"Christ has risen, Christ has risen indeed." These are comforting words to our ears. Christ has died and was raised on our behalf. But these words can be difficult to understand at the same time. In seminary I read many books on the different theological interpretations on why Christ went to the cross. It seems that every theologian has a different perspective on this event. I guess for me, I am reminded of Matthew 18:2-4 (NRSV).

2 He called a child, whom he put among them, 3 and said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. 4 Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

As we try to understand the death and resurrection of Christ, it might be easier to understand it from the eyes of a child. When we start to overcomplicate the story, it begins to lose its significance. We cannot allow the significance to be lost. Christ went to the cross, died on the cross, was separated from God for three days, and arose from the grave. This was the ultimate demonstration of Agape (God's Love). Christ went to the cross so that we may have life, life abundant.

As we enter April 2021, we do have life abundant through Christ. COVID-19 or nothing else can take that love away from us. As Spring begins, we see this abundant life everywhere- in the tulips, buds on the trees, ducklings, the grass turning green - stop and take the time to experience it. Take the time to experience Christ's love for you. Then take his love (Agape) to those around you. "Christ has risen, Christ has risen indeed."

Mission Outreach

Selah Food Bank: The space at the food bank, although in the same place, is looking expanded, fresh and inviting. Washington State, Northwest Harvest and the community all help fill the shelves and fresh produce boxes. Soon, we will be able to be part of that effort to collect food that will go directly to Selah area residents who depend on the food bank.

Camp Hope: In March, the Wesley UMC bakers and cooks prepared a new recipe of Cottage Pie. Do you know Cottage Pie? They delivered this pie, mixed vegetables, coleslaw, cake and milk to 70 or more grateful residents. Good news for Camp Hope! The county commissioners helped secure funds to deliver and install new portable shelters that will double the camp's capacity, making the total approximately 200. The shelters are being prepared for new residents and the hope is they will be occupied soon. Camp Hope is converting several portable classrooms for the temporary housing. Each portable will house about 36 people; each portable will be divided into two pods, one for adult women and one for adult men. Another will be divided further to create smaller spaces where families can stay together. Director Kay estimates that the family units should be able to house 10-15 families. He also hopes to prepare and house a permanent shelter for young people. Currently, there is no permanent overnight shelter for young homeless people in Yakima. The tentative plan at Camp Hope is to house young adults ages 18-24, with one pod for men and another for women. Permission from regulatory authorities is pending for unaccompanied minors. When fully operational and occupied, Camp Hope and Noah's Ark will have 200 to 250 mouths to feed. Wesley UMC is discussing and planning how that much food can be prepared and delivered each month. As pandemic restrictions ease, perhaps Selah UMC will be able to assist with this mammoth cooking commitment one night a month.

The Rod's House Young Adult Extreme Weather Shelter that began the first week in November at the graciousness of Motel 6 and the meticulous planning of the Rod's House staff will close on March 31st. The meal partners from all over the Yakima community helped feed over 100 different young adults over those months. Rod's House is also pleased to announce a new director, Mark James. He is excited and looking forward "to great things in the future with the help from our network of support." Here are a few needed items on their spring Wish List: art supplies of all kinds, bras in all sizes, NEW men and women's underwear in all sizes, new or gently worn shoes in all sizes, FULL sized toiletries.

WORSHIP NEWS

The Worship Team met on Zoom on March 2nd to finalize plans for Lent, Easter and Holy Week. The group first reviewed activities since the last meeting. It was noted that the Church Council approved a One License subscription, and that it has been used several times during worship. It was noted that there were 18 people logged In to the Ash Wednesday service, which was greater than the number who attended last year's service.



Palms have been ordered for Passion/Palm Sunday. There will be a drive-thru **palm distribution** on **March 27th** (the day before Palm Sunday). It will be held **from 2 PM until 4 PM**. Just drive through the church parking lot and pick up your palms. They will also be distributing Communion "kits", which consist of a sealed cup of grape juice and a communion wafer. The kits can be used for the Maundy Thursday worship service on April 1st. We will be interested in hearing feedback on the kits. **The Maundy Thursday**

worship service will be held on Zoom at 7:00 PM.

The United Methodist Men's group has made a large cross which has holes drilled in it. The plan is to have it decorated with flowers for Easter. There will be buckets of water set out near the entryway of the church, and folks are urged to bring flowers which will be used to decorate the cross. A picture of the decorated cross will be shown at the beginning of the Easter Zoom service. While you are there with your flowers, take a look at the Little Pantry, which holds food that is available to community members in need.

There will be an in-person **Sunrise service** at the fire pit behind the church. **It will start at 6:20 Easter morning.** Bob Ruud has agreed to start a fire in time for the service. Use of face coverings and social distancing will be required, and there will be no congregational singing or unison readings. Bring your lawn chair, pray, listen, and enjoy the sunrise. The regular **Easter celebration worship service** will be held on **Zoom starting at 10:30** on Easter morning.

The metrics are improving, but not enough to allow us to start in-person indoor worship yet, and even if we were to do so, we would miss out on a lot that helps make in-person worship meaningful, like singing, hugs, handshakes, and after-worship snacks. Please be patient, but remember: wherever we worship, Christ is there with us!

It gives the women a chance to become independent and earn money to help support the families, and educate their children.
