# Selah United Methodist Church Mark's Remarks

Advent is the traditional four-week season of preparation preceding the celebration of Christmas. For most of us, gift-giving is an important part of our Christmas observance. I know of many whose Advent emphasis includes planning, shopping and providing meaningful gifts to members of our family, to our friends and to the needs of the poor. Our culture encourages the giving of gifts at Christmastime.

While the Apostle Paul reminds us that it is more blessed to give than to receive, I pray that our Advent journey finds a balance between finding the perfect gift to give and receiving the perfect gifts God offers us.

The four Advent Sundays of worship, marked by the four candles of the Advent wreath, draw attention to the extraordinary gifts bestowed upon us by the birth of Jesus Christ: hope, peace, joy, and love. These gifts, rooted in the profound grace of God, offer comfort and inspiration as we journey through the challenges of life.

The first candle we light symbolizes God's gift of hope, a beacon in the midst of darkness. In a world often shadowed by uncertainty, we find assurance in the promise of a Savior, the fulfillment of God's plan to bring the light of hope to our world, to our lives, and to the world through our lives.

The second candle represents God's gift of peace, a peace that surpasses our understanding. In a world filled with turmoil, we seek the tranquility that comes from resting in the arms of our Prince of Peace. The light of this candle reminds us to embrace the stillness that Christ offers, allowing it to permeate our hearts, our homes, and the relationships we have with others.

God's gift of joy is the theme of the third week of Advent. Joy is a flame that dances with infectious energy. The joy of the Lord is our strength, and in the midst of life's challenges, we rejoice in the knowledge that our Savior has come and continues to be with us.

On the morning of Christmas Eve, the fourth Advent candle symbolizes God's gift of love—the very essence of God's nature. God is love and God's love came down at Christmas. Love is the divine gift that binds us together in unity. The candle of love is a shining invitation to live in God's love, sharing it generously with others.

This Advent season calls us to a deeper understanding of these themes, urging us to reflect on the significance of Christ's birth in our lives. It is a season of preparation, a time to open our hearts to the transformative power of hope, peace, joy, and love.

## **Selah Naches Food Bank**

Ten of us from SUMC attended the new food bank tour on November 16th. Members of the food bank board of directors were there, graciously and gratefully showing us around and



answering questions. Becky Johnson presented our \$2500 Harvest Fest donation proceeds to Gena Franklin, Treasurer, who was very appreciative. The building space and advance planning are quite impressive! When in full operation, the warehouse will hold a lot of food; room temperature, fresh, cold and frozen with optimistic hopes of eventually serving 400 on their usual Monday and Friday schedule which will be one hour longer.

Tentative plans are to open in December. Until then, all the food in their now off-site storage center will be

transferred and shelved. The Yakima Tennis Club has offered on November 27th to assist moving food to the new building.

The food bank is anxious to have new volunteers to help on Mondays and Fridays. You may contact Tammy or Dave Ripperger at 509-379-1715 for information if you would like to become a Selah Naches Food Bank volunteer.

Needless to say, the Selah Naches Food Bank will be especially busy in December, but they will continue to serve the community as they always do. ## **Rod's House**

During these cold days and nights, Rod's House on Naches is serving 50 teens and young people each weekday and the Days Inn Extreme Weather shelter is serving about 20 more. That is 70 homeless young people who are needing food, warm clothing and a warm place to spend the nights and mornings. As we tuck into our own warm beds, it is hard to imagine being outside.

For our Angel Tree this year, we have chosen Rod's House homeless teens to receive our Angel Tree gifts. Find the details here in a separate article. Twenty-five young people, mainly teens, have made a special gift request. Please choose an Angel on December 3rd from the Angel Tree and return your wrapped gift the following Sunday, December 10th.

## **WORSHIP TEAM REPORT**

The Worship Team of Selah United Methodist Church met at the church on November 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm in the evening. The Team hoped that scheduling the meeting in the evening rather than the afternoon would encourage folks who had jobs that kept them from attending a meeting in the afternoon would be able to attend a meeting in the evening. There were no visitors to the meeting.

The Team had a lengthy discussion about the All-Saints service, specifically about who we were honoring at the service: was it to honor CHURCH MEMBERS who had died during the past year, or was it to include folks who had been active in the life of the church, but who had never joined the church. Church membership was on the minds of many because we were approaching the vote on becoming a "Reconciling Congregation", which would be restricted to members only voting. It was decided to recommend that ACTIVE CONSTIUTUENTS would be honored in the future. The next task was to decide what qualified someone as being ACTIVE. We finally decided that being in a church directory would qualify an individual or family from being considered active. The team will review this decision a year from now when All-Saints is in the planning stages.

The Team discussed how we wanted to recognize military veterans on Veteran's Day. It was decided we would invite veterans to stand at the end of the worship service, and offer a place at the front of the line at the potluck which followed the worship service on that day. The group discussed decorating the church for Advent/Christmas. It was decided that we would ask for 5-8 trees of varying heights. Some of the trees would be arranged in the Chancel

and the front of the Sanctuary. It was also decided to have an artificial tree in the Narthex that could be used for an "Angel Tree" or any other use. Someone on the Team agreed to provide a pre-lit tree for that purpose. We set a goal of having the trees in place by December 3<sup>rd</sup>, The first Sunday of Advent. The Advent Wreath will also be ready for that service. Kevin has scripts for the lighting of the Advent candles. The group would like to see groupings of folks this year, including one group of people who live alone, but who could work with others who live alone. We also suggested that some of the people be new to the congregation in the last year or so. Kevin will be asking people if they are willing to volunteer.

An invitation will be offered to the congregation to come to the decorating of the church on Saturday, December 2<sup>nd</sup> at 9:00 AM. There will be a Longest Night service on December 21<sup>st</sup> for those who have experienced the death of a loved one. There was also a discussion of whether to have Communion on the early Christmas Eve service, but that decision is up to the Pastor. The next meeting of the Team will be November 29<sup>th</sup> at Noon. That meeting, like all Team meetings, are open to any one who wishes to attend.

THANK YOU!! THANK YOU!! The congregation and friends of Selah United Methodist Church are AMAZING!! With God's guidance and answered prayers we have received a miracle this fall. Last summer the air conditioning unit for the Sanctuary failed and we spent the summer worshiping in the Fellowship Hall where it was much cooler. The trustee and finance teams went to work trying to figure out the best course of action to remedy the situation and come up with a plan to fix or replace what we had. A decision was made to replace all the heating and air conditioning units with high efficiency heat-pumps to service the entire original building space. Bids were obtained and the estimate came in at \$75,000. The plan was approved at the Charge Conference held on October 25th. We started the process to raise the funds needed and to apply for a loan with the Faith Foundation to allow us to get started with the replacement. A letter was sent out to all people that are currently attending or that have been touched by SUMC in the past in some way. With the amount of money that has been received and pledged to be given within the next week or two, we have enough to fund the project, without the need for a loan from Faith Foundation. We have \$72,007.04 in the bank as of November 28th. Any funds that continue to come in from the appeal that was mailed out will be used to help retire the existing loan with the Foundation we are paying off and to fund the yearly maintenance contract with Campbell and Company. By the time you see this

newsletter, installation of the new system will have begun and if all goes well, by next Sunday should be functioning.

Wouldn't it be wonderful to be able to continue to grow the giving to the Church in order to provide for capital needs/repairs. To have the ability to establish a capital reserves fund in our budget would truly be a gift from God for SUMC made possible by over and above regular giving. Handicap accessible restrooms, easier access to the Chancel area of the sanctuary... what else can you add to the list. God will help us achieve great things, if we just pray and ask.

# **The Angel Tree**



A month ago, Rod's House sent out a request for the community to help give Christmas gifts to their young people. After contacting, Enya, the delightful person in charge, we have 25 names, all teenagers ages 13 - 17, with their Christmas requests. You will see that it will be a little different than in years passed. Rod's House staff asked that there be a limit of \$50 while at the same time saying that **no gift** needs to be valued as high as \$50. Some of the gift requests are for items far less \$50 in value. One young girl

requested a journal and pens and pencils. Choose the gift that pleases you, but spend only what you can. A gift card toward the item you chose is perfectly acceptable if choose to not buy the specific item but instead a gift card that can be used toward purchase of the item. For example, if a teen requests a pair of boots, and you want to only spend \$25, buy a gift card to be used towards the purchase of the boots. Another option is to partner with someone and split the cost to buy the one item. If the requested item cannot be purchased for \$50, (too expensive) a gift card is perfectly within the guidelines. It may sound a little confusing here, but it should be clear when you see the angels. We have 25 angels and probably that many or more who would like to buy a Christmas gift. If you want to contribute, a restaurant gift card or Walmart, Target or other gift card can be added to smaller gifts such as the journal request or given to Rod's House to gift to others who did not complete a request card. Please keep in mind the \$50 limit.

Please choose an angel on Sunday, December 3rd and return your wrapped gift with the angel attached and a Christmas label with the name of your teen. Thank you, everyone.
