I finished my bachelor's degree at Central, spent a year at Boston University School of Theology, and then transferred to the School of Theology at Claremont for 3 years, where I finished, graduating with both my Master of Divinity and My Doctor of Ministry degrees in 1985. I was ordained Deacon in 1984 while still in school and was ordained Elder in 1987 while serving my first appointment. During our college years, Gail worked full time as an Occupational Therapist for California Children's Services, and we had our first 2 children. Andrea was the first and MegAnn was our second. Gary was born while we were appointed to our first church.

So, I have 3 children and 5 grandchildren and have had a blessed and wonderful life as a father, a husband, and a pastor. I am truly blessed to now be the pastor at Selah UMC for a little while. This is just a little of who I am, but it gives you a quick outline. I am a storyteller, and you'll probably hear more about my life and my growth in faith as we get to know each other. Mission Outreach





Winter and severe cold temperatures are hitting the area hard at the beginning of the new year. The assistance and giving of the community continues in abundance despite the severe weather upon us. Our little Free Pantry stays replenished by our congregation and our Selah Food Basket in the Sanctuary continues to be filled month after month and emptied with

nonperishable food items that go to the Selah Food Bank. The shelves at the food bank appear full with a variety of boxed and canned goods, winter produce and even toiletries. NW Harvest and the local community provide to the food bank helping the volunteers to serve the many, many Selah area people who depend on the food bank. SUMC is a small provider, but the volunteers are always so grateful for our generosity.

January and February are Boxed Dinner and Cereal Months or your choice of any non-perishable food item

The Rod's House Severe Weather Shelter through the generosity of Motel 6 is in full operation. Each night, twenty-four homeless young people are given rooms with beds and showers plus a warm meal provided by the Meal Partners. Our church has partnered and provided chili, baked potatoes with condiments and dessert each month and weekly sandwiches during the summer months throughout the pandemic.

The cooks and bakers at Wesley UMC plan, organize, prepare and deliver a regular monthly meal for the 100 or more residents at Camp Hope and 50 or more residents at Noah's Ark in Wapato. Preparing for that many and delivering a hot meal is not an easy endeavor, but it happens every month. The Wesley ladies count on the SUMC donations of food contributions and delivery assistance. Our part again may seem small, but our involvement helps their large commitment to these homeless populations.

During December, the social worker at Selah High School, knowing our desire to help local students, reached out to our congregation for shoes and warm clothes for one of her students. Another student, tearfully told her how her four younger siblings would not have Christmas this year. Our Ladies Circle heard about this family and donated generously.

Our huge giving spirit continues as it always has. Your love of our neighbors is boundless. In love and gratitude to each of you who give so much, your time and food and money all with love to keep our ministry going.





WORSHIP TEAM REPORT

The Worship Team didn't meet during the month of December, but on December 1st we welcomed the third pastor for the year 2021. Jim Simpson was appointed to serve as an interim Pastor until June 2022. Jim is a retired pastor who lives in Lakewood, Washington. He is no stranger to the East side of the state, having served churches at Pomeroy, Leavenworth and Grandview. His son-in-law is the pastor at Wesley in Yakima, and his wife grew up in that church. We need to remember to wear our name tags to worship services and meetings, so Jim has an opportunity to learn our names.

The theme for Advent was "Coming Home" with topics of "Time to Go Home", 'The Fear of Home", "The Joy of Home", "The

Blessing of Home" and "Welcome Home". It seemed to be an especially meaningful series, because for the majority of the year we were unable to worship in the church building because of COVID. Christmas Eve there was indeed a sense of welcoming back.

COVID continues to cause anxiety about health in the community. Members of Selah UMC have been faithful about wearing masks and staying distanced from others in an effort to protect the health of each of us. That is the essence of Christianity: to love one another just as God has loved us.

We want to recognize and thank Gwen Chaplin, Elaine Dow, and Dorothy Munroe, who helped gather materials and assemble the Advent Wreath this year. Other folks came and helped to decorate the pillars in the Sanctuary, placed garland on the Communion rail and the railing in the balcony, and Don and Connie Schramm got the Christmas Tree. We were intending to have an item in the bulletin explaining the symbols that are part of the Advent wreath, but it never appeared. The wreath is fashioned using a model set forth years ago by Mary Barrett. The description reads: "Rich in religious symbolism, the Advent wreath combines fresh and dried herbs. Rosemary is the legendary herb that changed its flowers from white to blue in Mary's honor; lavender represents purity and virtue; sage is the herb of immortality; rue is the herb of grace and symbol of repentance; and thyme is an herb of the manger. Multiflora rose hips and dried blooms of yarrow, cockscomb and tansy add color."

The Team has scheduled a meeting for 2 o'clock January 13th at the Simonson Room. The meeting is open to all folks who have an interest in worship or have suggestions to make.





To the congregation of Selah United Methodist Church:

During the past two years we have had the same people serving on the Church Council since there were no changes made last year due to the Covid interruption in our Church operations. Some people actually served

an extra year from their original 3-year commitment and to those individuals goes a great big THANK YOU! This meant that this year the Team responsible for recruiting new faces to the council had double duty to do in several positions. Thanks for the work and efforts accomplished by that Team.

Thank you to the people that answered the call to serve on various teams of the Church Council. We have 12 new names on the list joining in different area of leadership. We have three important positions that remain unfilled at this time. We need a secretary for the Church Council. This person would attend the Council meetings each month, take notes and submit minutes of the meeting to be kept on record at the Church. Help is available with the minutes if necessary. We try to recruit for a 3-year term, but can be flexible if needed.

Also, we are in need of a 3rd person to serve on the Trustees team. This would be a 2-year term, ending at the close of 2023. This person would attend the Council meetings each month. It needs to be known that the trustees don't have to the be the people doing all the "work" to get things done and fixed around the Church. This is the team that we can bring issues to and they can determine what should be done and "who you gonna call" to see that the work is accomplished.

We do not have a Membership secretary and do need one. This person is responsible to maintaining membership records, recording new members, baptisms, transfers of people requesting moves to different Churches and deaths of members.

We do not have Youth Group team leader, but at this time don't have any youth so will look to fill this position at a later time.

If you would be willing to serve in any of these positions, please let Pastor Jim or me (Gail Davis) know. The Council meets the 3rd Wednesday of each month at 6:00 pm.


We Are A Giving Group


