It was agreed that we would not celebrate Scouting Ministries Sunday this year, as Pastor Dirk was unable to make contact with Scouting leadership.

UMCOR Sunday will be celebrated on March 22nd, the fourth Sunday of Lent. We are so fortunate to have a group of folks who have travelled to the UMCOR (United Methodist Committee On Relief) depot in Salt Lake City who will be sharing their experiences working preparing boxes of relief supplies for shipment to places where people's lives have been effected.

Holy Week begins with our Palm Sunday service on Sunday, April 5th. Please join us for this remembrance of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Maundy (Holy) Thursday worship will be at 6:00 PM on April 9th. It will be a service of footwashing. Although Selah UMC will not hold any Good Friday worship services or prayer vigils, we were reminded that the Yakima Association of Faith Communities sponsors an ecumenical worship service at noon at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in downtown Yakima. Easter Sunrise (SonRise?) Service will be at 6:00 AM on Easter morning at the cross in the field behind the church.

A couple of decades ago, Del and Jan Towell returned from a trip to Eastern Europe with a Conference Choir, and shared with the Selah UMC a tradition they had observed. It involved decorating of the cross with Spring flowers. Del and Jan would go in early Easter morning and using flowers donated by the congregation would create a "vine of flowers" that would wind down and around the cross. When Del and Jan were to longer able to do the ladder work involved, Don and Gwen Chaplin took over the job of coordinating the decorating. **Recently Mike and Michelle Helseth have coordinated the activity, but they will be unable to do so this year. We at Selah United Methodist Church and many other Selah organizations do our best to help supply the food bank with basic staples. Do you know that Northwest Harvest is also a major contributor of food?

From their website, Northwest Harvest serves more than 65 hunger relief programs and 13 schools in 9 counties in Central Washington. In addition to securing local produce from growers, we bring staples such as rice, beans, pasta, meat and fish into the region to make sure families are provided well-rounded, nutritious meals.

Hunger isn't just the absence of food – it's the absence of justice.

Northwest Harvest is focused on changing the conversation on solving hunger here at home – from a model based on charity, to one rooted in social justice.

In addition to making sure those who suffer from hunger have increased access to healthy food, we aim to shift public opinion, as well as impact institutional policies and societal practices that perpetuate hunger, poverty, and disparities in our state.

March 21st is the next Northwest Harvest volunteer Saturday.

Come join Wesley and other community neighbors pack weekend meals for school children enrolled in the Backpack Mission. It is an hour and a half of friendly conversation and worthy mission outreach.

A REQUEST FROM THE CHURCH COUNCIL

At the February 19th Council meeting a request/suggestion came from the worship team that we should have some way of tracking "in kind" gifts that are given for the operation and maintaining our Church. We do not want to discourage anyone from continuing to provide those things, but we are asking that amounts be tracked and reported to the committee. A form has been developed that is available in the office and on the bulletin board to record material gifts. The completed form can then be placed in the finance section next to the door into the inner office. Including your name is optional. You could obtain a form and keep a running tally if you would rather not do it each and every time you supply something for the Church and then periodically turn it in. Again, this is just a means to be able to have an accurate idea of what it really costs to operate as Selah United Methodist Church. We thank you for your gifts, and understanding of why we are requesting this be done.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on <u>Ash Wednesday</u> and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. When we participate in the service of ashes, we confront our sin. We recognize our inability to live up to all God has created us to be, and our need to be forgiven. No matter how often

we go to church, how far we have come in our spiritual journeys, how accomplished we may feel, each of us has sinned and fallen short of the glory of God.

The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry. Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others. Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter" and the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.
