To the Congregation of SUMC:

I had a conversation with our District Superintendent, Daniel Miranda, last week and the Cabinet and Bishop are working on our need for a new pastor. At this point, there is someone that they feel would be a good match

as an interim pastor but that person is not available until January. So, we will continue with Mark Williams as pulpit supply until that time. Noah will be able to remain in the parsonage until Dirk completes his training and the Navy comes to move them to the East coast in November. Daniel also said there are a couple of people he feels would be good candidates for Selah, but they are not available until the regular appointment process next spring with a start time of July 1, 2022. So, we will continue with the status quo for now and support one another as we move forward with our ministries within the Selah/Yakima community.

They have requested boxed dinners in October such as Hamburger Helper, Rice-A Roni, Pasta-a-Roni or any non-perishable food item that will

help put a good meal on the dinner table. Whatever your donation to the grocery basket in the sanctuary, the food bank volunteers are always grateful for your generosity. The lead volunteers are Tammie and David. David, who drives the yellow Selah Food bank truck, has recently learned that his cancer has returned. He is going strong but needs our prayers.





OCTOBER IS BOXED DINNER MONTH

Camp Hope is struggling with financial setbacks making plans for expansion and continuation of their community projects of helping the local homeless and regular cleanup of the Greenway difficult. Their meal partners are important as always. In September, Wesley cooks and bakers prepared another hearty meal of sliced ham, hash brown casserole, coleslaw, mixed vegetables, apple crisp and milk.

- Rod's House has a steady number of teens and young adults who depend on a hot meal and pocket snacks every afternoon Monday through Friday from noon to 4:00. With the arrival of cooler weather, the coats, sweatshirts and sweaters and much more that you have donated will help keep those young people warm as they head out to the streets in the evening.
- NW Harvest has not yet scheduled any volunteer opportunities, but their ongoing work of serving in the Yakima Valley continues.
- We have heard from Elizabeth Pereira who is the Student & Family Advocate Coordinator for Selah High School expressing appreciation for the church and Dirk's past partnership with the high school. They are seeking donations of toiletries (shampoo, conditioner, toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc.) for students, and are also providing a food pantry, and warm clothing/backpacks. Donations of any of these items would be appreciated. There will be a box in the Narthex where you can leave such donations and they will be delivered to the high school.



WORSHIP TEAM REPORT

The Worship Team (Committee) met September 14th on ZOOM to accommodate Rev. Mark Williams in Kennewick. The group discussed COVID concerns. So far, we have been lucky that there have been no known cases within the worshipping congregation. Folks have been very good about following the protocols of distancing and wearing face coverings. There was some concern expressed about folks gathering in the Narthex following worship. Mark is going to move from the Sanctuary door to the outside area to greet people as they leave. The group also discussed possible changes in the order of worship. There has been no adverse reaction to the changing of the Creedal Statement each week. We talked about Children's Time. Mark is planning to incorporate a time reminding us that we are all children of God. We also discussed a time to greet our fellow worshippers, but it wouldn't involve leaving your seat, but waving at someone or texting someone on the other side of the Sanctuary. We also want to remind everyone in the congregation, wherever they are worshipping, not to forget to greet people they don't see in worship, through texts, emails, letters, or phone calls. The relationships between us are what defines us as a church. We will continue using the Common English Bible (CEB) in worship and those texts will be displayed on the screens.

Our church family grew on September 26th: Nathan and Heather Miller joined the church and their daughters Rebekah and Miella were baptized, thus becoming Baptized Members. Welcome!!

For World Communion Sunday (October 3rd), a small round table will be placed at the back of the Sanctuary and covered with a white cloth. The Communion elements will be there to be picked up by folks on the way to their seats. An Usher will take the elements to anyone who misses getting them on their way in.

The Team also discussed Laity Sunday and Children's Sabbath, which fall the same day this year. We also discussed All-Saints Sunday (November 7th) Veteran's Sunday (November 14th – no display of military memorabilia this year). If you have a friend or relative who you want to remember on All-Saints, please talk to Kevin Dow.

We would like to recognize all of the things that Noah does to make our worship possible. He monitors the sound levels from the microphones, makes sure the proper slides are displayed on the screens, oversees the "broadcast" of our worship service on ZOOM, and is a resource to help solve all the problems arising from the technology. He will no longer be with us after Thanksgiving (maybe earlier), and if we are to continue to have all the innovations we have come to count on, some folks will need to learn all the things that he has been doing. If you

Selah UMW met September 21st via zoom. It was nice to get back in touch with everyone. **We would like to congratulate Lisa Holyfield for getting accepted into the Deaconess program.** What does it take to become a Deaconess?

Requirements for the Office of Deaconess and Home Missioner (A Home Missioner is male and Deaconess is female):

- 1. A call from God to lifetime, full-time mission-oriented service as part of the lay diaconate.
- 2. Membership in The United Methodist Church.
- 3. The professional training, education, and/or certifications for the ministry to which one is called.
- 4. Biblical, theological, and sociological grounding in the prescribed core studies:

Old Testament

New Testament

Theology of Mission

History of The United Methodist Church

Polity and Doctrine of The United Methodist Church

Core studies may be taken at United Methodist institutions of higher learning or at colleges, universities, and/or seminaries that are approved by the University Senate of The United Methodist Church. Intensive courses (one-to two-week) and other alternative program options are available. Prior coursework may be reviewed for approval of the core studies. Limited financial assistance based on need is available for core study coursework.

5. At the time of consecration and commissioning, position (compensated or non-compensated) in an approved appointment of love, justice and service.



- 6. Appointments may be in a church-related vocation or helping profession. A deaconess or home missioner must hold local church membership in the annual conference in which she or he will be serving.
- 7. Continuation of the practice of discernment
- 8. Ability to serve no less than 10 years of creditable service at the time of consecration
- 9. Commitment to functioning through diverse forms of service directed toward the world to make Jesus Christ known in the fullness of his mission, which mandates that his followers:
 - a. Alleviate suffering.
 - b. Eradicate causes of injustice and all that robs life of dignity and worth.
 - c. Facilitate the development of full human potential.
 - d. Share in building global community through the church universal
